POLICY - CHAIR & VICE CHAIR MAXIMUM TERMS OF OFFICE

- 1. A person proposed for the role of Chair should previously have served as Vice Chair or Chair. Ideally a new Chair will be the previous year's Vice Chair.
- 2. The Chair should serve a maximum of 3 consecutive one-year terms in the role. This person should not be eligible for election as Chair or Vice Chair for 3 years after leaving office no matter how many terms they have served.
- 3. The Vice Chair should serve a maximum of 3 consecutive one-year terms in the role. This person should not be eligible for election as Vice Chair for 3 years after leaving office no matter how many terms they have served. However, they would be encouraged to seek election as Chair, when the rules above would apply.
- 4. It is recommended that a new Vice Chair will have served at least 3 years as a Parish Councillor before their first election to the role.

This policy was adopted by Ashby Herringfleet & Somerleyton Parish Council on 12th January 2023

Background to the policy: Should one person remain in post for a long period it will have a detrimental effect on the Parish Council because:

- the Parish Council will reflect only one person's leadership
- fewer people will have sufficient experience to take over should the Chair suddenly become unable to continue
- a vibrant Parish Council depends on continually questioning its approach and a regular change of leadership ensures this
